

Bayan College completes **GFP** audit process

eneral Foundation General (GFP) of Bayan College completed the audit process by OAAAQA.

GFPs are implement-ed by all HEIs in Oman to support and develop students' skills and knowledge in four areas of study: English Language, Mathematics, Computing and General Study Skills.

The Quality Audit is the first stage in the accreditation process of GFP which is designed to encourage universities and colleges to develop their internal quality management system. The first stage of the audit process was a self-study report which was submitted in August 2021. OAAAQA evaluates the program based on four scopes: 1) Governance and Man-agement 2) GFP student learning 3) Academic and Student Support Services and 4) Staff and Staff support services.

New programmes at Bayan College



College has avan introduced three new programmes: 1) The Bachelor of Arts in Human Development and Family Studies;

2) Masters in English Language and Literature; 3) Masters in Communication.

The Human Development and Family Studies major concentrating in Individual and Family Services is mainly aimed at students looking to work with adolescents or adults in the realm of human services.

The Masters in English Language and Literature is aimed at students looking to increase their understanding of the English language and bring it back into the real world, whether as a teacher, copywriter or translator. Graduates in English can look forward to a world of English that they may not have seen before.

The Master in Communication aims at giving an in-depth understanding on the work of media across social, economic and cultural contexts guaranteeing high quality media professionals.

This program focuses on the ever-changing field of communication studies and latest methodologies the needed for the understanding of mass communications, rhetoric, media ethics and research.





Bayan College Staff attend Arab Social **Media Forum**

nstructors from Bayan College attended the 8th Arab Social Medium Forum held in Dubai on September 22, 2021.

The forum, organized by Mangusteen Company in partnership with PAZ mar-keting, discussed the latest challenges, trends and opportunities in social media during the pandemic.

The event consisted of six main sessions and two individual talks.

The first session was about 'The Rise and Fall of Digital Services and Business' and it explored the growing interest of people to use digital services due to the lockdown. The second discussion was on 'Innovation in Government and Medical Entities', which focused on the way the government has worked to minimize the effect of the pandemic in the country by finding fast solutions.

The third session was on the 'Future of Social Media' and it emphasized the increasing dependence of the audience on social media and the bright future.

The fourth session was about 'The Revolution of User Generated Content'. The session dealt with the increase in number of people who are able to create their own content bringing various

view points and creativity. The fifth topic was 'The State of Influencer Marketing' and the numerous benefits that could come up from using influencers in marketing. The final talk was on 'The



Traditional Media vs New Media', which discussed the advantages and disadvantages of both traditional and new media. The event started with a welcome keynote from the

founder of Arab Social Media Forum, Mr. Malik Shishtawi.

The Arab Social Media Forum was founded in 2010. It is the first specialized event in the Arab region to target

social media topics sharing both clients' and agencies' experience in dealing with social media platforms and different audience engagement

strategies.

Paper on assessment of media convergence, social media presented

Mr. Samuel Mundua, Senior Lecturer, De-partment of Media, made a presentation at a virtual conference organised by the School of Media and Communication, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Dubai Campus on February 18, 2021.

The main theme of the conference was: Reimagining the Media and Entertainment Landscape during COVID-19 Pandemic. The title of Mr. Samuel's presentation was 'An assessment of media convergence and its implications on social media audience response patterns during Covid-19 Pandemic in Oman'.

The presentation focused on how media organizations are influencing social media audience response patterns during Covid-19 pandemic in Oman.

The paper attempted to explore the implications of the practice of media convergence as a strategy in influencing social media audience response patterns through quantitative approach. It intended to specifically assess the social media audience response patterns on converged media content on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram during the Pandemic.

Paper on impact of digital media presented

The main theme of the Dubai 4TH AFU International Conference Towards Advanced Scientific Knowledge (TASK-2021) was Scientific Research in the Present Crisis Era.

The sub-themes of the conference emphasized the perspective of intersection between social sciences and other fields of knowledge.

The title of the research paper presented was 'Digital Media and sociocultural transformation - A study of Graduate students in Oman'.

Ms. Kavitha's and Dr. Abhishek's presentation mainly focused on the way new generation were getting influenced by the present digital media.

The study was mainly on the young students and change in their behaviour.

The main reason for the study was to examine the practical impact of social media on the sociocultural values of undergraduates.

Conclusion of the study showed that majority of undergraduates who use new media are having severe behavioural transformation. The study found that the use of new media affects the social cohesion of undergraduates. It has also been found that the use of new media has adverse effects on the culture of undergraduates' students. The methodology used in this study was primary in nature and data collected through questionnaire (online).
